First Hunt Mentoring Programs



Women & Girls' Program



This program provides supportive, encouraging, and inspiring female mentors/coaches who understand how to overcome the unique barriers women may face when embarking on their first hunt. The mentors/coaches will also grow themselves as they assist new hunters on their journey.

The First Hunt Foundation's main emphasis is mentoring new hunters. Mentor based experiences can develop lifelong skills and a passion for hunting. This support for hunting can be passed on to future generations of new hunters.

Veterans & First Responders Program



First Hunt Foundation has tremendous respect for our national and local heroes. All veterans and first responders understand mission, teamwork and the desire to serve. We want to connect these heroes to a new mission of recruiting new hunters and helping those in their own ranks learn about conservation and hunting.

Our 2022 Accomplishments

2022 marked First Hunt Foundation's eighth year of operations. With COVID restrictions behind us, all activities were abale to renew in earnest, allowing staff to attend several sporting industry events and our volunteers to host numerous training and hunting events across the country. We continue to grow and expand across the nation, with volunteers operating in 40 states. Some of our major accomplishments for the year were:


- Recruited an additional 212 background checked mentors/coaches
- Partnered with multiple organizations and businesses
- Recruited new State Directors for Montana
- Opened new chapters in Washington and Montana
- Established our new "Share The HERitage" program which is focused entirely on introducing new female hunters of all ages to the sport
- Set the framework in place for a new program focused on increasing diversity and recruiting new hunters from historically underserved communities in 2023
- Secured hunting access on over 200,000 acres of private land
- Attended numerous industry trade shows including:
 World Deer Expo in Birmingham, AL
 Hunt Expo in Salt Lake City, UT
 SCI National Convention in Las Vegas, NV
 Sheep Show in Reno, NV
 Central Oregon Sportsman's Showin redmond, OR
- Expanded our operational footprint to include 40 states
- Successfully completed 11861 mentored days*
 Estimated economic impact of mentoring/coaching activities: ~\$1.18M

^{*}Mentored Days include 5257 Hunting Days and 6604 Training Days. Total New Hunter count for the year was 2251 which includes 959 Adults and 1292 Youth, of the total, there were 1285 Female and 966 Male. Economic impacts based on 2016 USFWS estimates of ~\$50/hunter/day. Statistical averages (95% confidence interval) were assigned to volunteers who were unable to respond to our annual data survey.






MENTORED DAYS




ECOMOMIC IMPACT




MENTORED HUNTING DAYS BY SPECIES




MENTORS BY AGE GROUP









